PARTS, SERVICE AND INSTALLATION MANUAL GENERAL INFORMATION GENERAL SAFETY



General Information

Before working with the attachment, each person must do the following:

- Read the complete manual, including safety messages and decals.
- Review all available documents about the machine, including hazard assessments and operation manuals.
- Make the working area safe, by keeping all personnel and objects at the safe working distance (refer to original equipment manufacturer documents).

PARTS, SERVICE AND INSTALLATION MANUAL INSTALLATION COUPLER INSTALLATION



Installation

Move the machine to a flat area, where all sides of the machine can be accessed.

Remove all attachments from machine stick.



The quick coupler uses WBM pins or OEM pins.

Install the stick pin first, then the power link pin.





WARNING

Operation

- Conduct a workplace hazard assessment before using the coupler.
- Couple and uncouple attachments away from all personnel. Be careful of the attachment dropping
- If a quick coupler is not working correctly: remove it, inspect it and have it repaired.
- Each quick coupler is designed to fit one type of lugs. Do not attach to different or unidentified lugs.
- Do not use a quick coupler as a lifting device.

Incorrect operation may result in property damage, serious injury or death.

Operation

Coupling the Attachment

- 1. Put the attachment in a safe position: at ground level, stable, away from personnel and objects, etc.
- 2. Turn the safety lock, so the wedge bar will not move.



- 3. Make sure all personnel are away from the operating area of the machine.
- 4. Put the stick and boom in an approximate 90° configuration. Align the coupler with the attachment.

5. Move the coupler's front bosses into the attachment's front saddles.



6. Extend the bucket cylinder to move the coupler's rear bosses into the attachment's rear saddles.

The rear bosses must be firmly against the rear saddles, or the wedge bar will be too high to engage the lugs.

- 7. Before leaving the cab, or letting personnel go near the machine, lock the excavator's hydraulic functions.
- 8. Make sure the operator's seat is empty before going near the quick coupler.
- 9. Turn the safety lock to engage the wedge bar.



10. Fully engage the wedge bar. The wedge bar must be firmly against the lugs (but not touching the front of the lugs, see maintenance section).

- 11. Do a secure engagement test:
 - a. Position the attachment on the ground.
 - b. Apply down pressure by lifting the tracks.
 - c. Cycle the bucket cylinder and try to force the coupler from the bucket.



If the coupler needs adjustment: safely position the attachment on the ground and tighten the bolts.

WARNING

Do a secure engagement test each time an attachment is coupled.

Incorrect coupling may result in property damage, serious injury or death.

WARNING

Couple and uncouple attachments away from all personnel. Be careful of the attachment dropping Failure to do so may result in property damage, serious injury or death.

Uncoupling the Attachment

- 1. Put the attachment in a safe position to be uncoupled (at ground level, stable, away from personnel and objects, etc.) The attachment could move after uncoupling.
- 2. Position the stick and boom in an approximate 90° configuration.



- 3. Before leaving the cab, or letting personnel go near the machine, lock the excavator's hydraulic functions.
- 4. Make sure the operator's seat is empty before going near the quick coupler.

- 5. Loosen the bolts retaining the wedge bar. Do not remove them.
- 6. Move the wedge bar out of the lugging: if stuck, use a mallet or the excavator's hydraulic functions.
- 7. Turn the safety lock, so the wedge bar will not move.



WARNING

Make sure that all personnel are at the safe working distance from the machine and the attachment is safely positioned. The attachment may move when uncoupled. Failure to do so may result in property damage, serious injury or death.

8. Retract the machine's bucket cylinder and linkage to move the coupler's rear bosses out of the attachment's rear saddles.

9. Fully move the coupler's front bosses out of the attachment's front saddles.

WARNING

Maintenance

- Do not use an attachment that is not working correctly.
- Have a qualified technician inspect and repair the attachment.
- The technician must read the manual before maintenance.
- This manual is not a replacement for training and experience.
- Do not modify any part of the attachment without WBM's approval.
- Avoid pinch points.
- Fully support all attachments and linkages before maintenance or inspection.
- Always wear personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Repair or replace any worn or missing components before operating the attachment.
- Keep all personnel and objects at a safe working distance.

Incorrect maintenance may result in property damage, serious injury or death.

Maintenance

Before Starting Maintenance

Only qualified personnel should complete maintenance and inspections.

Before starting maintenance or inspection:

- 1. Confirm the area is well ventilated.
- 2. Position and support the attachment.
- 3. Follow machine lockout procedures and ensure the machine will not accidentally start up.
- 4. Block the wheels.
- 5. Wear proper protective equipment.
- 6. Disengage the coupler from the attachment.
- 7. Position the coupler for easier inspection.
- 8. Clean the coupler. Always use the correct cleaning agents and never use flammable solvents.

PARTS, SERVICE AND INSTALLATION MANUAL MAINTENANCE DAILY AND YEARLY INSPECTIONS



Daily Inspections

Inspect daily for:

- Cracks or damage in components. Before repairing any welds, or cracking, contact WBM for recommended welding procedures.
- Component wear. Signs of wear include: scratches deeper than 1/32 inch (0.8mm); clearances of more than 1/32 inch (0.8 mm) between contacting surfaces; or, the wedge bar touching the front of the attachment lugs. Contact WBM for the recommended repair procedure.
- Bolt tightness. Replace bolts showing wear or damage. Replace wedge bar retaining bolts with grade 8 or stronger bolts.
- Inspect using NDT (non-destructive testing) methods after each incident of overloading.



Yearly Inspection

Perform a complete inspection of the coupler using NDT (non-destructive testing).

WARNING

A worn or damaged coupler may fail. Any wear, cracks or component damage must be repaired before operation of the attachment. Operating a damaged attachment may result in property damage, serious injury or death.
